### Outreach to Members of the Deaf Community

Harbor House, in collaboration with Deaf Unity, will host a free training Oct. 6 for local law enforcement, emergency health care providers and sexual assault response teams on strategies for responding to deaf victims of domestic abuse and sexual assault.

### Serving Individuals with Physical Limitations

Harbor House's shelter is fully wheelchair accessible inside thanks to good planning and ongoing building assessments by staff and accessibility experts. An important next step: Creating accessibility to our children's outdoor play area.

### Providing Help to LGBT Survivors

Harbor House's dedication to ending oppression by offering equitable services to all populations extends to the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities, who experience domestic abuse at rates equal to their heterosexual peers.

## WOMEN OF COLOR COMMITTEE TO FOCUS ON NEEDS, SERVICES, ISSUES

Harbor House has long been focused on learning all we can about diverse populations of people who need our services and developing strategies for how to provide the best service possible to meet specific needs. One of the most recent steps in this direction is the formation of our Women of Color Advisory Committee.

Co-facilitated by Harbor House Community Education and Outreach Coordinator Kadihja Kelly and Reach Counseling's Lola Smith, the WOC Advisory Committee is on a mission "to empower all women of color by enhancing their leadership capacity through collaboration, networking and education."

The group hopes to accomplish three main objectives: 1) Create safe and compassionate spaces; 2) Eliminate violence affecting communities of color (domestic abuse, sexual assault, racial profiling, human trafficking, police brutality and hate crimes); and 3) Strengthen relationships with allies in the community. The primary goal is to address issues regarding oppression, disparity of services and the lack of active leadership roles among women of color in the Fox Valley.

"When people say, 'We're all one race,' they are attempting to treat everyone equally; however, it is sometimes hurtful and demeaning to

people of color," Kelly said. "These statements make light of the true problem here, which is racism and that people do pay attention to skin color, ethnicity and culture. Most women of color who enter Harbor House not only have experienced abuse within their relationship, but have also faced oppression through services they sought and well-intentioned people. Our committee's hope is to change those negative experiences."

### Focus on Strategic Initiatives

#### Meet the Needs of a Broad, Diverse Population

The Fox Valley region is growing in population, as well as in the number of cultural groups who comprise the total community. This growing mix of cultural groups means that Harbor House must create programs and communications that make the services offered through the organization available to a diverse group of cultures. In addition, the needs of these groups must be understood from a cultural and personal perspective.
